BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris they being the governing body thereof as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter §447-2 of the ordinances of the Township of Morris is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 67-5. Membership fees.

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B. Membership fees shall be paid in full with the filing of the application for membership.

C. Weekday (Monday to Friday) Daily Admission is available to Township residents only beginning August 1, 2016 at the rate of \$15.00 per person payable at the pool gate. Resident identification is required. Daily admission is available to non-residents beginning August 1, 2016 at a rate of \$20.00 per person payable at the pool gate.

C. Guests will be permitted to members as follows:

Registered prior to May 1st:

Each Family membership will receive eight (8) free one(1)-day guest privileges, each Couple membership shall receive five (5) free one (1)-day guest privileges, and each individual membership will receive four (4) free one-day guest privileges, which guest privilege may be used at any time during the current pool season only.

Registered May 1st or later:

Each Family membership will receive four (4) free one(1)-day guest privileges, each Couple membership shall receive three(3) free one (1)-day guest privileges, and each individual membership will receive two (2) free one-day guest privileges, which guest privilege may be used at any time during the current pool season only.

Thereafter, guests will be permitted to members by purchasing a daily guest pass at the pool at a charge of \$10 each per day on weekdays and \$15 each per day on weekends and holidays. However, all members may purchase cards of 10 one-day guest privileges at the rate of \$75 for each card of (ten)10 from the Parks and Recreation Department, which guest privileges may be used at any time during the current pool season and the following pool season. All guests, however, must be accompanied by the member at all times. Failure to accompany the member at all times may result in revocation of the membership without refund.

D. No fees are returnable for any reason after opening day of each season.

E. Children's group swim lessons may be offered at the discretion of the Township of Morris. If offered, said lessons shall be available to the children between the ages of 4 and 12, four (4) days a week for two (2) weeks at a cost of \$25 per child for a current Swim Pool member and \$35 per child for Non-Members residing in Morris Township. Private swim lessons for children or adults are available to pool members only at a cost of \$20.00 per person per 30-minute class.

F. Swim team is offered to all children between ages 6 –17 at a cost of \$55 per child.

G. Lost card fee is \$10.00 per card

SECTION TWO: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION THREE: All Ordinances of the Township of Morris which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication thereof, as provided for by law.

" AMENDING THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS – CHAPTER 258 ENTITLED FEES - IN PARTICULAR-ARTICLE II ENTITLED RECREATION PROGRAMS § 258-8(E)(1) FEES-SCHEDULE FOR RECREATION PROGRAMS"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, they being the governing body thereof that the Code of the Township of Morris is hereby amended as follows:

(DELETION OF § 258-8 SECTIONS "A" THRU " D" IS HEREBY REPLACED WITH THE FOLLOWING)

SECTION ONE: Chapter §258-8 of the ordinances of the Township of Morris is hereby amended to read as follows:

§258-8 General Program Fees

(2) Fees required under Section A (1)., above, **except trips**, shall be waived for any Township resident receiving public assistance. For the purposes of this section, public assistance shall include participation in the following: Welfare assistance, subsidized housing, federal school lunch program, food stamps, or other forms of public assistance.

(3) Recreation program fees may be reduced or waived by the Director of Parks and Recreation for individuals with disabilities participating in youth and/or adult service organizations incorporated as not-for-profit organizations as defined in Section 501 (c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and serving residents of the Township of Morris. Such reductions or waivers shall be requested in writing to the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation and shall include the specific justification for the fee waiver or reduction request.

SECTION TWO: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION THREE: All Ordinances of the Township of Morris which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication thereof, as provided for by law.

The summary terms of such ordinance are as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, they being the Governing Body of said Township, as follows:

1. Effective January 1, 2016 the following salaries for non-union employees as established in ordinance 07-15, 12-15 and 27-15 are hereby increased by 2.0%. Effective January 1, 2016 the following salaries or compensations are established for the following named officers, employees, or positions in the Township of Morris.

CALENDAR YEAR 2016 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION
LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4 45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Township of Morris, in the County of Morris, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2016 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body for said year, amounting final appropriations otherwise advisable and necessary; and, hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the to \$882,910.85 in excess of the in the Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated, as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Township of Morris, in the County of Morris, a majority of the full authorized of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Morris shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40: 45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$882,910.85 and that the CY 2016 municipal budget for the Township of Morris be approved and adopt accordance with ordinance; and,

BE IF FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

(d) The Supplemental debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and submitted to the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township is increased by \$223,500 (the amount of the authorization of the obligations provided for in this bond ordinance). The obligation authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law, provided that such debt is subject to dedication from gross debt under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-44.

SECTION SEVEN. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 8. This bond ordinance shall effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE NO. 12-16**

RE: AMENDING CHAPTER 118 ENTITLED “POLICE DEPARTMENT”, IN PARTICULAR ARTICLE I ORGANIZATION §118-1B AND §118-9

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 118 (Police Department) is hereby amended as follows:

**ARTICLE I
ORGANIZATION**

§118-1B. The Chief of Police shall be head of the Police Department and shall be directly responsible to the appropriate authority for the efficiency and routine day to day operations thereof. The “appropriate authority” as used herein shall mean the Township Administrator of the Township of Morris. The Morris Township Administrator is hereby designated as the “Appropriate Authority” in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-118.

§118-9. Authority of Township Committee and Township Administrator.

- A. The Township Committee shall, in consultation with the Township Administrator establish rules and regulations respecting the Department. Further, the Township Committee shall make provisions for the acquisition of such apparatus, equipment and vehicles as may be necessary or useful for the Police Department. After consulting with the Township Administrator and Chief of Police, the Township Committee may authorize the hiring of any sworn police officer.
- B. The Township Administrator shall have the following responsibilities with respect to the Police Department.
 - 1. The Township Administrator shall be the liaison between the Township Committee and the Police Department and shall report to the Township Committee on all matters concerning the Police Department.
 - 2. The Township Administrator shall be responsible for establishing and/or amending, as may be necessary, the “Table of Organization” for the Police Department.
 - 3. The Township Administrator in consultation with the Chief of Police shall be responsible
.....for the establishment and administration of a promotional process for the Police
.....Department, and shall be responsible for making all promotional recommendations to
.....the Township Committee.
 - 4. The Township Administrator shall be the final authority for the determination and disposition of disciplinary charges made against any member of the Police Department, following a disciplinary hearing. The Township Administrator may serve as hearing officer for the final discipline of any disciplinary charges. Alternatively, the Township Administrator shall have the authority to appoint, subject to the approval of the Township Committee, an independent hearing officer for the disposition of disciplinary charges. In the event the Township Administrator appoints an independent hearing officer, the hearing officer shall make all necessary findings of fact and conclusions of law as to any charges and, in the event of a finding of guilty on any or all of the charges, shall determine a penalty. The findings of fact and conclusions of law of the hearing officer, together with the penalty (if any) determined shall be immediately communicated to the Township Administrator in the form of a written opinion.

Thereafter, the Township Administrator shall have the authority to accept, reject, or modify any portion of the opinion of the hearing officer. The decision of the Township Administrator shall constitute the final municipal action in the matter.

SECTION TWO: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this ordinance.

SECTION THREE: all ordinances of the Township of Morris which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION FOUR: this ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication thereof as provided by law.
