AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 447, SWIMMING POOLS, ARTICLE I, MUNICIPAL POOL, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS, TO REPLACE SECTION 447-5, MEMBERSHIP FEES IN ITS ENTIRETY

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris they being the governing body thereof as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter §447-5 of the ordinances of the Township of Morris is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§ 447-5. Membership fees.

- A. The fees and charges associated with the Municipal Pools shall be established annually by resolution of the governing body.
- B. Membership sales shall be offered annually.

The Township reserves the right to change or restrict membership sales based on swim pool capacity limits NJ Department of Health requirements.

- C. Membership fees shall be paid in full with the filing of the application for membership.
- D. Guests will be permitted to members as follows:

Each Family membership will receive four (4) free one (1)-day guest privileges, each Couple membership shall receive three (3) free one (1)-day guest privileges, and each individual membership will receive two (2) free one (1)-day guest privileges, which guest privilege may be used only during specified times during the current pool season.

Use of One-day Guest Passes and use of Guest Cards for admission is limited to Weekdays until closing and Weekends and Holidays after 3:00 pm until closing.

Members will be permitted to purchase and enter guests at the pools by purchasing a Daily Guest Admission at the pool.

All members may purchase cards of ten (10) one (1)-day guest privileges from the Parks and Recreation Department, which guest privileges may be used during the current pool season at designated days and hours. All guests-must be accompanied by the sponsoring member at all times. Failure to accompany the member at all times may result in suspension or revocation of the membership without refund.

Members may purchase a two-week Visitor Pass for a child sixteen (16) years of age and younger visiting their household upon presentation of a certifying letter from the child's parent or guardian that the child is related family, and that the child will be in the care of that member for that two-week period of time. A non-photo Visitor Pass Card will be issued to the member for the visiting child. The sponsoring member shall be present at the pool at all times when the Visitor is using the pool.

- E. No fees are returnable for any reason after opening day of the current season, including unused guest punch cards.
- F. Children's group swim lessons may be offered at the discretion of the Township of Morris.
- G. Swim team is offered to all children with a swim pool membership between ages 6-17. Swim team participants must be current members or staff of the Morris Township swim pools.
- H. Specialized Program & Training Fees may be offered at the discretion of the Township of Morris.
- I. Active volunteer members of the Morris Township Fire Department, the Morris Township Office of Emergency Management, and the Minute Men Volunteer Emergency Medical Services shall receive a seasonal pool membership for themselves and their immediate family (as defined in this Ordinance) at no charge for the membership season. The chief operating officer of each unit shall certify that the volunteer qualifies as an active member for that year.
- J. Individual full-time employees of the Township of Morris shall be eligible for a seasonal swim pool membership at no charge for the current membership season. Additional family members may join at pro-rated membership rates.

SECTION TWO: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION THREE: All Ordinances of the Township of Morris which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication thereof, as provided for by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Morris in the County of Morris, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Morris hereby determines that a 1% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ \$289,447.57 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Morris hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Morris, in the County of Morris, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Morris shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$1,013,066.50, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Township of Morris be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,


BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE V, OPEN SPACE COMMITTEE, ARTICLE V, SECTION 9-25, FUNDING OF OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS

WHEREAS, the Township Committee (the "Committee") of the Township of Morris (the "Township") desires to amend the language of the Code of the Township, Article V, Section 9-25; and

WHEREAS, the Committee hereby finds and declares that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to amend the language of the Code of the Township of Morris, Article V, Section 9-25 and adopt the amendments to same.

NOW BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris they being the governing body thereof as follows:

SECTION ONE: Section 9-25 of Article V of the Code of the Township of Morris is hereby amended as follows:

The Open Space Trust Fund shall be funded through the dedication to the fund of an amount **not to exceed** \$0.03 per \$100 of assessed valuation of each annual tax levy. The fund shall also be permitted to accept donations and testamentary bequests.

- A. The fund accumulated within the trust fund may be utilized for the acquisition of land or development rights in land or a down payment for the issuance of bonds for the purpose of acquiring lands for recreation, conservation and open space purposes.
- B. Said funds may also be used for any purpose not inconsistent with Green Acres requirements, including capital improvements on lands acquired for recreation, conservation and open space purposes, provided said lands are listed on the Township's Recreation and Open Space Inventory. This authorization for capital improvements shall apply to those capital improvements that qualify as capital improvements pursuant to the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1, or Local Budget Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-1. The amount allocated for capital improvements shall not exceed 50% of the annual open space trust tax levy.
- C. Said funds may also be used for the acquisition of farmland preservation.
- D. Said funds may also be used for as a down payment and for the payment of debt service or indebtedness issued or incurred by the Township of Morris for any of the purposes set forth in this article.
- E. Said funds may also be used to fund, in whole or in partnership with other public entities or appropriately qualified private nonprofit entities, the acquisition of lands or interests therein so as to preserve the same as open space. It is permissible pursuant to this section, for funds to be used for the purpose herein when actual title to the preserved lands shall be in another appropriately qualified entity.
- F. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:12-15.7, said funds may also be used to maintain lands acquired for recreation and conservation purposes, subject to the restriction that the Township shall not annually use more than 15% of the unencumbered fund balance existing December 31 of the immediately preceding year.

SECTION TWO: If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION THREE: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions of the Township which are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.



§ 15-7 Vacations and holidays.

E. The following ~~42~~¹³ days are designated as official holidays. In ~~January~~ December of each year, an annual list shall be published indicating the dates that each holiday will be celebrated for the following year.



SECTION THREE: All ordinances of the Township of Morris which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 88, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, ARTICLE II, PARKING, STOPPING AND STANDING TO ADD SECTION § 88-2.13, DEFINITIONS; SECTION § 88-2.14, PUBLIC PARKING SPACES FOR CHARGING OF ELECTRIC VEHICLES; SECTION § 88-2.15, FEES FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING AND RESTRICTIONS; AND SECTION § 88-2.16, VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES; AND ADOPTING SCHEDULE XXXIII

WHEREAS, the Township has installed public parking spaces for the charging of electric vehicles, and;

WHEREAS, the Township of Morris seeks to establish definitions, fees, and regulations pertaining to said parking spaces and adopt a schedule designating the location of the parking spaces within Morris Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris:

SECTION ONE. The above Whereas clauses are ratified and confirmed as true and correct.

SECTION TWO. Chapter 88, Vehicles and Traffic, Article II, Parking, Stopping and Standing, is hereby amended to add the following:

§ 88-2.13 Definitions pertaining to electric vehicle parking.

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this section:

Charging station.

A location that is fitted with charging station equipment.

Charging station equipment.

The conductors, including ungrounded and grounded, and the electric vehicle connectors, attachment plugs, and all other fittings, devices, power outlets, charging status or apparatus installed specifically for the purpose of delivering electrical energy from the charging station to the electric vehicle.

Charging station space.

A dedicated, marked parking space that is fitted with charging station equipment and exclusively used for the charging of electric vehicles.

Electric scooter and/or electric motorcycle.

A two-wheel or three-wheel electric vehicle that operates exclusively on electrical energy stored in the vehicle's batteries.

Electric vehicle.

A vehicle that operates, either partially or exclusively, on electrical energy from a charging station or other electrical energy source that is stored in the vehicle's battery for propulsion purposes. "Electric vehicle" includes: a battery electric vehicle; a plug-in hybrid electrical vehicle; a neighborhood electric vehicle; and electric scooters or electric motorcycles.

Neighborhood electric vehicle.

An electric vehicle that is a low-speed vehicle, built to have a top speed of 25 miles per hour and have a maximum loaded weight of 3,000 pounds.

Nonelectric vehicle.

A vehicle that does not meet the definition of "electric vehicle" as provided herein.

Plug-in hybrid electric vehicle or PHEV.

An electric vehicle that contains an internal combustion engine and also allows power to be delivered to drive wheels by an electric motor; charges its battery primarily by connecting to a charging station or other electrical source not on board the vehicle; may additionally be able to sustain a battery charge using an on-board internal-combustion-driven generator; and has the ability to be propelled through the use of electricity.

§ 88-2.14 Public parking spaces for charging of electric vehicles.

The municipality has designated parking spaces at locations locations In Schedule XXXIII for use as charging stations.

§ 88-2.15 Charging fees for electric vehicle parking spaces and restrictions.

A. The following fees shall also apply to use of parking spaces in Schedule XXXII that are identified as charging station spaces, twenty-four (24) hours a day:

- (1) For up to one hour of charging: \$1.50.
- (2) For more than one hour and up to two hours of charging: \$3.00.
- (3) For more than two hours of charging: \$5.50.
- (4) For more than three hours and up to four hours of charging: \$8.00.

B. Use of said charging station spaces shall be limited and restricted as follows:

- (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing a vehicle in a stall or space that is designated as a charging station space unless the vehicle is an electric vehicle as defined in this section and is connected for electric charging purposes; and
- (2) Electric vehicles are authorized to park in spaces designated as charging station spaces only during the time when the vehicles are connected for electric charging purposes or up to four hours, whichever is less. Within fifteen (15) minutes of the time the vehicle is no longer charging, the owner or operator of said vehicle shall be required to remove the vehicle from the charging station space. If the owner or operator of said vehicle allows his or her vehicle to remain in a charging station space while the vehicle is no longer charging past the fifteen (15) minute grace period, then said owner or operator shall be in violation of this section.

§ 88-2.16 Violations and penalties.


The police department of the Township of Morris may remove from any parking space any unattended vehicle parked or standing in any portion of said parking facilities which such vehicle is in violation of this article. When a vehicle is so removed from said parking space, the owner of said vehicle shall pay, before being entitled to the recovery or possession of said vehicle, all reasonable charges for towing, storage and other expenses incurred in the removal of said vehicle. In addition, thereto, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this section or any supplement or amendment hereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$100.00.

SECTION THREE: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, unenforceable, or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: All Ordinances of the Township of Morris which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.



AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS, COUNTY OF MORRIS CONCERNING SALARIES FOR NONUNION PERSONNEL

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, they being the Governing Body of said Township, as follows:

1. Effective January 1, 2022 the following salaries for non-union employees as established in ordinance 05-21 are hereby increased. Effective January 1, 2022 the following salaries or compensation ranges are established for the following named officers, employees, or positions in the Township of Morris.

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THAT ALL NEW RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS OF APARTMENTS OR APARTMENT STYLE HOUSING OF TWELVE UNITS OR GREATER TO BE ALL-ELECTRIC BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, the Township Committee (the "Committee") of the Township of Morris (the "Township") desires to amend the language of the Code of the Township to require that all new apartment complex or apartment style housing of twelve units or greater be all electric building, and

WHEREAS, gas appliances emit several pollutants including carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxide among other which have been linked to several adverse health effects, particularly in children; and

WHEREAS, the Committee wishes to encourage and facilitate the construction of all-electric buildings which are designed and built to reduce overall energy demand and safer to avoid the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning among other adverse health effects; and

WHEREAS, in light of the serious threats posed by climate change, it is necessary and appropriate to adopt enhanced energy conservation construction requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Committee hereby finds and declares that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to amend the language of the Code of the Township of Morris and adopt the amendments to same.

NOW BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris they being the governing body thereof as follows:

SECTION ONE:

1. Definitions:

All-electric Buildings shall mean a building or project that uses a permanent supply of electricity as the sole source of energy to meet building energy needs. An all-electric building or project shall have no natural gas, propane, or oil heaters, boilers, piping systems, fixtures or infrastructures installed to meet building energy needs.

Building Energy Needs shall mean all space conditioning including heating and cooling, water heating including pools and spas, cooking appliances and clothes washing and drying appliances.

2. On or after September 1, 2022, the Township Engineer and/or Construction Official shall not issue a construction permit for a new apartment complex or apartment style housing comprised of twelve (12) or more dwelling units unless the permit requires the building to be constructed as an All-electric Building
3. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 2, the Township Engineer and/or Construction Official may issue a permit for a new mixed-fuel building upon a finding by the Planning Board that construction of an all-electric building is physically or technically infeasible. Financial considerations shall not be sufficient basis to determine physical or technical infeasibility.


4. If a modification is issued under paragraph 2 of this subdivision, the applicant shall pay or agree in writing to pay any costs related to the connection of any gas main and/or transmission system to ensure that such costs are not subsidized by other service class rate payers. Those costs include but are not limited to the material and installation of the pipe, conduit, duct, or other facilities to be installed.

SECTION TWO: If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION THREE: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions of the Township which are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.



BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS BY THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS, APPROPRIATING THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$2,101,500 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,996,425 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Morris, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey (the "Township") as general improvements. For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,101,500 (which is the aggregate amount of the sums of money appropriated for each respective improvement or purpose), including the sum of \$105,075 as the down payment for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available by virtue of the provision for a down payment for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvements or purposes not covered by the application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,996,425 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements or purposes hereby authorized for which bonds or notes are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement or purpose and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement or purpose, and the period of usefulness of each improvement or purpose are as follows:

(a) The 2022 Road Overlay / Crack Sealing Improvements Project, including road overlay and crack sealing improvements to various roads throughout the Township as set forth on the project list filed in the Department of Public Works, and all work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local

Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell a part, or all, of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale, and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest, if any, from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale of bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the costs thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance, computed on the basis of the amounts of obligations authorized for each improvement or purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 8.47 years.

(c) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$300,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost of the improvements or purposes set forth in Section 3 of this bond ordinance.

(d) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and submitted to the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township is increased by \$1,996,425 (the amount of the authorization of the obligations provided for in this bond ordinance). The obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 7. Current Sewer Utilities Employees shall receive reimbursement up to \$3,400 for obtaining CDL license. Employees operating a backhoe for trenching or major roadway excavating shall receive an up rate of ninety (90) cents per hour. Employees operating grader maintainers, backhoes, or front-end loaders shall receive an up rate of sixty (60) cents per hour over and above the driver's rate of pay for eight (8) hours, if he is assigned as an equipment operator for more than four (4) hours in any work day.

SECTION TWO: The salaries or compensations shall be retroactive to January 1, 2022. Any Teamsters (Local No. 469) member retiring prior to enactment of this ordinance will be entitled to retroactive compensation provision of this ordinance. The established salaries or compensation shall be in lieu of any and all fees.

SECTION THREE: All full-time employees shall contribute towards their health benefits as required by State Statute, Chapter P.L. 2011. No Employee will be exempt from payment of such contribution based upon their coverage, health plan selection, compensation and other statutorily required criteria, if any.

SECTION FOUR: Employees receiving the enhanced dental plan coverage are required to pay the difference between the cost of the basic plan and the enhanced plan.

SECTION FIVE: The employee's grade classification shall be established on January 1 of each year as per current practice.

SECTION SIX: That the said salaries or compensation shall be in lieu of any and all fees.



**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CANCELLATION OF PROPERTY TAXES FOR
DISABLED VETERANS**

WHEREAS, the Township of Morris wishes to honor veterans who have suffered disability as a result of their service in the United States Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, a veteran who has been certified by the United States Veteran's Administration as an honorably discharged Veteran with an active duty service-connected disability evaluated to be 100% and permanent disability may be exempt from taxation on proper claim made therefor; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30 provides for the cancellation of real property taxes for veterans determined by the United States Veteran's Administration to be totally disabled; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.31, upon review and approval of the required documentation by way of application to the Township, the municipal tax assessor shall allow exemption from property taxation for the year in which the claim was filed beginning on the date of receipt of the completed application by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee (the "Committee") of the Township of Morris (the "Township") desires to cancel of property taxes for all veterans determined to be totally disabled by the United States Veteran's Administration and establish a formal policy providing that a refund of property taxes be effective to the date the completed application and all supporting documentation is received by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Committee hereby finds and declares that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to adopt this policy.

NOW BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris they being the governing body thereof as follows:

SECTION ONE: Definitions.

Application- The information required to be submitted by a veteran or the veteran's surviving spouse seeking a property tax exemption and conforming to the requirements of N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.31.

Tax Assessor - The Tax Assessor of the Township of Morris.

Property - The Real Property and the improvements subject to an exemption.

Township - The Township of Morris, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey.

SECTION TWO: Authorization of Tax Exemption for Veterans Determined to be Totally Disabled.

The Township shall provide for tax exemptions as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30.


SECTION THREE: Refund of Property Taxes for Veterans Determined to be Totally Disabled.

For a veteran, or his or her surviving spouse or domestic partner, entitled to exemption under N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, after a formal written request for a retroactive refund of property taxes as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.31, submitted to the Tax Assessor with all required documentation from the United States Veterans Administration, the Township Council, by appropriate resolution, shall return to the veteran or the veteran's surviving spouse all property tax payments made since the date the application is filed with the Tax Assessor. Retroactive refunds shall not be granted for property taxes paid prior to the United States Veterans Administration's date of determination of total disability and shall be limited to the date the Application was received by the Township.

SECTION FOUR: Effectiveness of Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication thereof, as provided for by law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS FOR PUBLIC CONTRACTING (“PAY-TO-PLAY”) REFORM

WHEREAS, professional business entities are exempt from public bidding requirements; and

WHEREAS, it has become common for professional business entities to make substantial political contributions to the election campaigns of the local government elected officers who are ultimately responsible for awarding professional service contracts or other contracts or agreements which are not subject to public bidding; and

WHEREAS, substantial local political contributions from professionals receiving discretionary contracts from the elected officials who receive such contributions raise reasonable concerns on the part of taxpayers as to their trust in the process of local government, if not the quality or cost of services received; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5 and N.J.S.A. 40:48-2, municipalities have the right to establish rules and procedures for contracting with professional business entities, and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee finds and declares that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to limit the amount of contributions that can be made by professional business entities.

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, County of Morris (the “Township”), as follows:

SECTION 1. Prohibition on Awarding Public Contracts to Certain Contributors

(a) For purposes of this ordinance, a “Professional Business Entity” means an individual including: (i) the individual’s spouse; (ii) any child living at home; (iii) firm; (iv) corporation; (v) professional corporation; (vi) partnership; (vii) organization; (viii) association; and/or principals who own 10% or more of the equity in the corporation or business trust, partners, and officers in the aggregate employed by the entity as well as any subsidiaries directly controlled by the business entity.

For purposes of this ordinance, a “PAC” means any political action committee that is organized for the primary purpose of promoting or supporting Township municipal candidates or municipal officeholders

(b) The Township shall not enter into an agreement or otherwise contract to procure services, including without limitation banking or insurance coverage services, from any Professional Business Entity, if that entity has solicited or made any contribution of money, or pledge of a contribution, including in-kind contributions, to a campaign committee of any Township municipal candidates or municipal officeholders, or to any Township party committee, or PAC in excess of the thresholds specified in subsection 1(d) herein within one (1) calendar year immediately preceding the date of the contract agreement.

(c) No Professional Business Entity which negotiates with or enters into any contract or agreement with the Township for professional services, banking or insurance coverage services, and/or any other no-bid consultants shall contribute or pledge to contribute to any: (i) Township candidate or office holder; (ii) Township of Morris political party; and/or (iii) PAC during negotiations for such a contract or during the term of said contract any sums other than those specifically permitted Section 1(d) hereunder.

(d) Without violating subsection (b) of this Ordinance, a Professional Business Entity may annually contribute a maximum of: (i) \$300 to any candidate for committee; and (ii) \$500 to a Township of Morris political party or PAC. However, any group of individuals meeting the definition of "professional business entity" under this section, including such principals, partners, and officers of the entity in the aggregate, may not annually contribute for any purpose in excess of \$2,500 to: (i) Township candidates and/or officeholders and/or Township of Morris political party and/or PAC; and (ii) any Morris County Political Party.

SECTION 2. Contributions Made Prior to the Effective Date

No contribution made by a Professional Business Entity shall be deemed a violation of this Ordinance, if such contribution was made by the Professional Business Entity prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. Contribution Statement by Professional Business Entity

(a) Prior to awarding any contract or agreement to procure services with any Professional Business Entity, the Township or any of its purchasing agents or agencies, as the case may be, shall receive a sworn statement from the Professional Business Entity made under penalty of perjury that the bidder or offeror has not made a contribution in violation of Section 1 of this Ordinance.

(b) The Professional Business Entity shall have a continuing duty to report any violations of this Ordinance that may occur during the negotiation or duration of a contract. The certification required under this subsection shall be made prior to entry into the contract or agreement with the Township and shall be in addition to any other certifications that may be required by any other provision of law.

SECTION 4. Return of Excess Contributions

A Professional Business Entity may cure a violation of Section 1 of this Act, if, within thirty (30) days after the election to which the contribution was attributed, the Professional Business Entity notifies the Township Committee in writing and seeks and receives reimbursement of such contribution.

SECTION 5. Penalty

(a) All Township of Morris professional service agreements shall provide that it shall be a breach of the terms of the government contract for a Professional Business Entity to knowingly conceal or misrepresent contributions given or received, or to make or solicit contributions through intermediaries for the purpose of concealing or misrepresenting the source of the contribution.

(b) Any Professional Business Entity who knowingly fails to reveal a contribution made in violation of this Act, or who knowingly makes or solicits contributions through intermediaries for the purpose of concealing or misrepresenting the source of the contribution, shall be disqualified from eligibility for future Township contracts for a period of four (4) calendar years from the date of the violation.

SECTION 6. Severability and Effectiveness Clause:

If any sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any persons or circumstances shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, or if by legislative action any sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall lose its force and effect, such judgment or action shall not affect, impair or void the remainder of this ordinance.

SECTION 7. Effective Date:

This ordinance shall become effective upon publication.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS FOR PUBLIC REDEVELOPMENT CONTRACTING (“PAY-TO-PLAY”) REFORM

WHEREAS, it has become more frequent for developers, sometimes at the request of candidates for local elected office or political party officials, to make substantial political contributions to the election campaigns for local government offices, and to the political parties which support them; and

WHEREAS, the local government officials are, once elected, responsible for deciding the terms of a redevelopment agreement; and

WHEREAS, political contributions from developers entering into agreements for redevelopment projects approved by the elected officials who receive such contributions raise reasonable concerns on the part of taxpayers and residents as to their trust in the process of local redevelopment, including but not limited to redevelopment decisions on tax abatements, zoning densities, publicly funded infrastructure improvements, and acquisition of property rights pursuant to eminent domain; and

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq., provides a mechanism to empower and assist local governments in efforts to promote programs for redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8 allows municipalities to enter into agreements with redevelopers for planning, replanning, construction or undertaking of any project or redevelopment work without public bidding and at such prices and upon such terms as it deems reasonable within areas designated for redevelopment;

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-11 provides that redevelopment entities are instrumentalities of the municipality;

WHEREAS, both the exceptions to the Open Public Meetings Act, more specifically N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8, provide that negotiations for such agreements can be conducted in executive session, provided the full terms of any such agreements are discussed and approved in open session;

WHEREAS, the Township of Morris (the “Township”) has previously or may declare certain areas of Morris to be Areas in need of Redevelopment or Rehabilitation under the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, and has or may adopt a Redevelopment Plan;

WHEREAS, given the potential of negotiating with private parties or redevelopers and the entering into agreements with such redevelopers without a formal public bidding process, as permitted by the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, it is necessary to establish certain limitations on political contributions which may undermine public confidence in any redevelopment effort;

WHEREAS, the restriction against local political contributions contained herein does not impair in any way the remaining opportunities for such redevelopers to speak, write, and publish

their sentiments about local elections and candidates or to volunteer or associate with campaigns of their own choosing;

WHEREAS, the Township Committee finds and declares that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to limit the amount of contributions that can be made by professional business entities.

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, County of Morris, as follows:

SECTION 1. Definitions

(a) For purposes of this Ordinance, a "Redeveloper" means an individual including: (i) the individual's spouse; (ii) any child living at home; (iii) firm; (iv) corporation; (v) professional corporation; (vi) partnership; (vii) organization; (viii) association; and/or principals who own 10% or more of the equity in the corporation or business trust, partners, and officers in the aggregate employed by the entity as well as any subsidiaries directly controlled by the business entity.

(b) For purposes of this Ordinance, a "PAC" means any political action committee that is organized for the primary purpose of promoting or supporting Township municipal candidates or municipal officeholders.

(c) For purposes of this Ordinance, the "Applicable Time Period" means the time period between the earlier of the: (i) the date that the property which is the subject of the redevelopment project has been included in a memorializing resolution adopted by the governing body directing the Planning Board to conduct a preliminary investigation to determine if the site is in need of redevelopment; or (ii) any request from the Redeveloper or its Professionals to have the property included in such resolution to the later of: (i) the termination of negotiations or rejection of any proposal; or (ii) the termination of the redevelopment agreement.

(d) For purposes of this Ordinance, a "Professional" means all consultants or lobbyists contracted, employed, or otherwise engaged by the designated Redeveloper to provide services related to the:

- (1) Lobbying of government officials in connection with the examination of an area and its designation as an area in need of redevelopment or in connection with the preparation, consultation and adoption of the redevelopment plan;
- (2) Obtaining the designation or appointment as Redeveloper;
- (3) Negotiating the terms of a redevelopment agreement or any amendments or modifications thereto; and
- (4) Performing any related terms of a redevelopment agreement.

SECTION 2. Prohibition of Entering Into or Amending Redevelopment Agreements with Certain Contributors

(a) To the extent that it is not inconsistent with state or federal law, and except as provided by Section 2(c) below, the Township shall not enter into any agreement, amend any agreement or otherwise contract with any Redeveloper, for the planning, replanning, construction or undertaking of any redevelopment project, including the acquisition or leasing of any public property in conjunction with the redevelopment of any area within the Township, if that Redeveloper who has solicited for or made any contributions to any Township candidates and/or officeholders, or any PAC during the Applicable Time Period.

(b) All development agreements or amendments thereto entered into by the Township shall contain a provision prohibiting Redevelopers from soliciting or making any contribution to any Township candidates and/or officeholders, or to any Morris or Morris County political committee or political party committee or to any PAC during the Relevant Time Period.

(c) Any individual meeting the definition of "Redeveloper" under this section may annually contribute a maximum of: (i) \$300 to any candidate for committee; and (ii) \$500 to a Township of Morris political party or PAC. However, any group of individuals meeting the definition of "Redeveloper" under this section, including such principals, partners, and officers of the entity in the aggregate, may not annually contribute for any purpose in excess of \$2,500 to: (i) Township candidates and/or officeholders and/or Township of Morris political party and/or PAC; and (ii) any Morris County Political Party. Such prohibitions shall apply to any Professional of the Redeveloper during the Relevant Time Period.

SECTION 3. Contributions and Contracts Made Prior to the Effective Date

No contribution made by a Redeveloper or its Professional shall be deemed a violation of this Ordinance, if such contribution was made by Redeveloper or its Professional prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. Contribution Statement of Redeveloper; Notice Given by Municipality

(a) Prior to arranging and entering into a redevelopment agreement with any Redeveloper, the Township shall receive a sworn statement from the Redeveloper made under penalty of perjury that the Redeveloper or any of its Professionals have not made a contributions in violation of Section 2 of this Ordinance.

(b) The Redeveloper shall have a continuing duty to report any violations of this Ordinance that may occur during the negotiation or duration of any Redevelopment Agreement.

SECTION 5. Return of Excess contributions

A Redeveloper may cure a violation of Section 2 of this Ordinance, if, within thirty (30) days after the election to which the contribution was attributed, the Redeveloper notifies the Township Committee in writing and seeks and receives reimbursement of such contribution.

SECTION 6. Penalties.

Any Redeveloper who violates Section 2 of this Ordinance shall have any current redevelopment agreement with the Township terminated and be disqualified from eligibility for future Township redevelopment agreements for a period of four (4) calendar years from the date of the violation.

SECTION 7. Severability and Effectiveness Clause:

If any sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any persons or circumstances shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, or if by legislative action any sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall lose its force and effect, such judgment or action shall not affect, impair or void the remainder of this ordinance.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 398, RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY, ARTICLE I, CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY, SECTIONS 398-1 THROUGH 398-6; AND CHAPTER 216, CONSTRUCTION CODES, UNIFORM, SECTION 216-3, FEES, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS

WHEREAS, the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), Chapter 23 of Title 5 of the Administrative Code of the State of New Jersey, establishes various terms and definitions, such as "Certificate of Continued Occupancy" (CCO); and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (NJDCA) has recommended that municipalities eliminate "Certificate of Continued Occupancy" (CCO) from local ordinances, as this citation of the UCC is not authorized to be used by municipalities for a resale or new tenant situation; and

WHEREAS, it has been recommended that "Certificate of Continued Occupancy" (CCO) be removed from the code of ordinances of the Township of Morris and replaced with "Certificate of Habitability".

NOW BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, they being the governing body thereof, that the following sections be amended:

SECTION ONE:

ARTICLE I

Certificate of ~~Continued Occupancy~~ Habitability

§ 398-1 Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

CERTIFICATE OF ~~CONTINUED OCCUPANCY~~ HABITABILITY

That document issued by the Township of Morris upon determination by the Township of Morris Uniform Construction Code Enforcing Agency or its designee that a dwelling is fit for human habitation in accordance with the provisions of the ordinances of the Township of Morris and the laws, rules and regulations of the State of New Jersey, including but not limited to compliance with the Uniform Fire Safety Act (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-192).

§ 398-2 Certificate of ~~continued occupancy~~ habitability required.

It shall hereafter be unlawful for a property owner to transfer title and/or possession to any residential real property in the Township of Morris without having first obtained a certificate of ~~continued occupancy~~ habitability prior to the sale, lease or occupancy of such premises. A certificate of ~~continued occupancy~~ habitability shall be valid for 90 days from date of issuance. It may be extended for an additional 30 days by the construction code official for good cause.

§ 398-3 Application and fee.

The owner of residential property for which a certificate of ~~continued occupancy~~ habitability is required shall make application therefor to the Township of Morris Uniform Construction Code Enforcing Agency on application forms furnished for that purpose. The fee for the certificate shall be as set forth in Chapter 216 and payable to the Township of Morris.

§ 398-4 Temporary certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability.

Upon inspection of any residential dwelling, the Township of Morris, in its discretion, may issue a temporary certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability, conditioned upon compliance with such specified conditions as may reasonably be required, such conditions to be satisfied within a period of time not to exceed 30 days.

§ 398-5 Fee for temporary certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability.

The fee for a temporary certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability shall be the same as for the permanent certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability as provided in Chapter 216 and shall be payable to the Township of Morris. Upon satisfaction of the required conditions, a permanent certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability shall be issued following reinspection.

§ 398-6 Violations and penalties.

A violation of this article may result in the imposition of a fine in an amount not to exceed \$100. In the event that title and/or possession of the residential property shall have been transferred, the transferee shall have the responsibility to secure the certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability required by this article. In the event that the transferee shall fail to have secured the required certificate of ~~continued-occupancy~~ habitability within 30 days of having received notice from the Township of Morris, the transferee and the transferor may be subject to the penalties provided for herein. Each day shall constitute a separate violation.

SECTION TWO:

§ 216-3 Fees.

A. The fee for a construction permit and all other permits required to be issued by the Construction Code Official of the Township of Morris shall be the fees set forth in the Department of Community Affairs fee schedule, N.J.A.C. 5:23-4.20, as amended.

- (1) through (6) No changes.
- (7) Municipal ordinance:
 - (a) Certificate of ~~continuing-occupancy~~ (CCO) habitability: \$125.
 - (b) Zoning approval: \$50.

SECTION THREE: If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION FOUR: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions of the Township which are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION FIVE: This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication thereof, as provided for by law.





**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRIS
AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE**

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Morris (the "Committee") desires to amend and readopt the language of the Code of the Township of Morris (the "Township"), Chapter 15; and

WHEREAS, the Committee hereby finds and declares that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to replace and readopt the language of the Township Code, Chapter 15 and adopts the amendments to same; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, County of Morris as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter 15 of the Code of the Township of Morris is hereby amended and replace as follows:

Personnel Policies

GENERAL REFERENCES

Article I
General Policies

§ 15-1 Policies established.

A. There are hereby established in and for this municipality the following personnel policies relating to all present and future municipal employees. The Township Committee shall adopt an Employee Handbook based upon these general personnel policies and shall amend or revise as needed. In the event there is a conflict between these policies and any collective negotiations agreement, personnel services contract, or Federal or State law including the Attorney General's guidelines with respect to Township personnel matters, the terms and conditions of that contract or law shall prevail. The Employee Handbook shall establish the policies based upon the following:

- (1) To recruit and retain for each position the best qualified person available within fiscal and organizational standards.
- (2) To provide for all employees the best possible direction, leadership, supervision, guidance, instruction and working conditions.
- (3) To base promotion and job security on ability, performance, experience and interest.
- (4) To maximize use of employee skills and abilities to ensure maximum level of service at minimum expense to the taxpayer.
- (5) To give first consideration to qualified Township personnel for promotion.

- (6) To treat each employee with justice, respect, courtesy and consideration.
 - (7) To require each employee to do the best work possible and extend to others consideration and courtesy.
 - (8) To urge the self-betterment of each employee by encouraging study as a means of self-improvement.
 - (9) To pay fair and adequate salaries for each position and in return to expect and require consistently a good job from the employee (i.e., a fair day's work for a fair day's pay).
 - (10) To impress each employee with the concept of responsible public service due the citizens, taxpayers and the general public.
 - (11) To inculcate and maintain in each employee a feeling of pride and job satisfaction as each employee is an important part of the finest community in the State of New Jersey.
- B. It is the policy of the Township of Morris that each employee shall always be treated fairly, courteously and with respect. Conversely, each employee shall always accord the same treatment to his fellow municipal employees, associates, department heads and to the general public.
- C. It is of the utmost importance that each employee of this municipality shall always conduct himself or herself in a proper manner and in such a way as not to reflect unfavorably upon the employee or the Township. This provision pertains to off-duty times and hours as well as to times and hours of employment. Each employee shall be diligent in obeying all state and federal laws and rules, regulations and ordinances of the Township of Morris and encourage others to do likewise. Each employee shall be careful that his or her behavior, actions, language, dress or conduct does not reflect to the detriment of the Township of Morris.
- D. The Township of Morris does not discriminate based on disability, pregnancy, pregnancy related medical condition or childbirth. The Township will endeavor to make every work environment handicap accessible and all future construction and renovation of facilities will be in accordance with applicable barrier-free Federal and State regulations and the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines, as well as the ADA Amendments Act.

The Township will not discriminate against any employee or job applicant with respect to any terms, conditions, or privileges of employment on the basis of a known or perceived disability, pregnancy, breastfeeding, pregnancy related medical condition or childbirth. The Township will also make reasonable accommodations to known physical or mental limitations of all employees and applicants with disabilities or pregnant employees, provided that the individual is otherwise qualified to safely perform the essential functions of the job and also provided that the accommodation does not impose an undue hardship on the Township.

- E. The Township is an equal opportunity employer. It is the Township's policy to extend equal treatment to all individuals in employment, compensation and other terms and conditions of employment without regard to race, creed, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, domestic partnership status, civil union status, atypical heredity, cellular or blood trait, genetic information, disability (including AIDS or HIV infection), pregnancy (including pregnancy related health condition), childbirth, liability for service in the United States Armed Forces, gender identity or expression and/or other protected classification under federal or state law.

§ 15-2 Vacations and holidays.

A. The policies pertaining to vacations and holidays shall be contained in the Township Employee Handbook and shall be revised and/or modified as necessary following these general principles:

(1) All employees shall be granted the following annual leave for vacation purposes, with pay, in and for each calendar year, except as otherwise herein provided:

Length of Service	Vacation Days
Completion of 6 months but less than 1 year	5
From 1st anniversary to 5th anniversary	10
From 5th anniversary to 12th anniversary	15
From 12th anniversary to 17th anniversary	20
From 17th anniversary to 22nd anniversary	25
After 22nd anniversary	30

(2) All employees entering full-time employment with the Township of Morris on and after January 1, 2012, shall be granted the following annual leave for vacation purposes, with pay, in and for each calendar year, except as otherwise herein provided:

Length of Service	Vacation Days
Completion of 6 months but less than 1 year	5
From 1st anniversary to 8th anniversary	10
From 8th anniversary to 16th anniversary	15
From 16th anniversary to 22nd anniversary	20
After the 22nd anniversary	25

B. Where in any calendar year the vacation or any part thereof is not granted by reason of the pressure of business, such vacation periods or parts thereof not granted shall accumulate and shall be granted during the next succeeding year only and is to be used within the first nine (9) months of the succeeding year, along with that year's vacation allotment. Carryover vacation not taken in the first nine (9) months of the succeeding year shall be forfeited. No annual vacation leave shall be taken without permission of the department head or the Township Administrator.

C. If any official holiday as listed in Subsection E occurs during an employee's vacation, the employee shall not be charged with use of a vacation day for the holiday.

D. The following 13 days are designated as official holidays. In January of each year, an annual list shall be published indicating the dates that each holiday will be celebrated.

- (1) New Year's Day.
- (2) Martin Luther King Day.
- (3) Washington's Birthday (President's Day).
- (4) Good Friday.
- (5) Memorial Day.

- (6) Juneteenth
- (7) Independence Day.
- (8) Labor Day.
- (9) Columbus Day.
- (10) Veterans Day.
- (11) Thanksgiving Day.
- (12) Day after Thanksgiving.
- (13) Christmas Day.

E. Effect of retirement, termination or resignation of employment upon vacation. Upon resignation, retirement or termination of employment, an employee will be credited with annual vacation for only those months of the calendar year worked, on a prorated basis of vacation earned on the schedule in Subsection A for each month of actual service. An employee who has, pro rata, used more annual vacation time than entitled to at the time of termination shall have an amount equal to his/her daily rate of pay deducted from his/her final pay for each day of annual vacation taken in excess of the number to which he/she was entitled. An eligible employee will earn vacation during the last month of employment in accordance with the following schedule:

- (1) Employment ends on the 24th day or later. The employee will earn full month's allowance.
- (2) Employment ends on the ninth through the 23rd day. The employee will earn 1/2 month's allowance.

F. No employee shall receive compensation for any accumulated vacation time upon retirement or resignation from employment with the Township. In the event of the death of an employee, the estate of the deceased will be compensated for pro rated accumulated vacation leave, which shall be the full amount of unused days for which the employee would have been entitled during the year in with the last day of active service is considered the day preceding the date of death.

G. Effect of extended absence upon vacation. An employee who, during the calendar year, returns from a continuous period of absence of more than six months due to a disability, leave of absence or layoff shall not be eligible for a vacation in that year until he/she has completed six months in the performance of duty after returning from such absence. These six months need not be continuous, but any period of absence of eight days or more shall not be credited in computing the required six months. Vacation is not earned during periods of leave of absence without pay.

§ 15-3 Administration procedures and records.

A. Each full-time employee shall receive a copy of the Employee Handbook of the Township of Morris, which shall be studied and retained for future reference. After a careful study of the policies, practices and rules set forth therein, and in this article, the employee is required to sign the statement signifying that he received a copy of this article and agrees to conform. The signed statement shall be returned to the office of the Township Administrator to be placed in the employee's personal history file.

- B. The personnel policies, practices and rules may be added to, changed, interpreted or eliminated whenever it appears to be in the best interest of the Township to do so.
- C. Copies of changes, additions or deletions shall be issued to each employee for retention with his copy of the personnel policies and practices of the Township of Morris.
- D. A personal history file shall be established and maintained for each employee of the Township of Morris by the Township Administrator.

(a) (1) Personal history files are confidential records and shall be maintained in the office of the Township Administrator in a locked file. The files shall be in two groups: "active," representing employees on the payroll, and "closed," for employees no longer in the service of the Township.

(2) Only the Township Administrator shall have access to any or all of the personal history files. The department heads shall examine the files of departmental personnel only for official purposes. Any employee may, at reasonable times, in the office of the Township Administrator, examine his own personal history file (except employment references).

(3) All personal history files will be carefully maintained and safeguarded permanently. Nothing placed in any file shall be removed therefrom.

(4) When, in the opinion of the Township Administrator, derogatory material is placed in an employee's personal history file, the employee shall be notified, in writing, of the action.

§ 15-4 Scope.

This article is intended to be general in character and cover all employees and departments of the Township where there is not now or there is not hereafter adopted a specific ordinance, separate contractual agreements or policies in the Employee Handbook adopted by the Township Committee covering the same subject matter. Where there is a specific ordinance or statute, separate contractual agreements or rules and regulations adopted by the Township Committee covering a particular employee or department, the same shall be controlling.

**Article II
Direct Deposit**

§ 15-5 Full-time employees and elected public officials.

All full-time employees and elected public officials who receive compensation from the Township of Morris are mandated to have direct deposit of their compensation.

§ 15-6 Seasonal and temporary employees.

Seasonal and temporary employees who are employed by the Township of Morris are exempt from the direct deposit mandate.

§ 15-7 Exemptions.

Municipal employees may request, in writing, an exemption from the direct deposit mandate, such request to be addressed to the Township Administrator, who may grant an exemption for good cause.

Section 2. Severability.

If any portion of this ordinance shall be deemed invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder shall survive in full force and effect.

Section 3. Repealer.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances or resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. When Effective.





WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has been engaged in a process to establish a competitive market place through deregulation and restructuring the electric utility market and/or natural gas market; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a government aggregator and an energy aggregation program to purchase electric generation service and/or natural gas pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:3-93., et seq. and N.J.A.C. 14:4-6.1, et seq. will increase competition for the provision of electric power and/or natural gas to residential and non-residential users, thereby increasing the likelihood of lower electric rates and/or natural gas rates for these users without causing any interruption in service; and

WHEREAS, under the aggregation process the residential and non-residential ratepayers may likely receive a direct reduction in their electric and/or gas bills; and

WHEREAS, the realization of energy cost savings is in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents and non-residents of the Township of Morris, and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee finds and declares that it is in the best interest of residential and non-residential ratepayers for the Township to create the opportunity for them to enter into an aggregation agreement in order to seek substantial savings on electric and/or natural gas rates; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, County of Morris (the "Township"), as follows:

1. The Township of Morris publicly declares its intent to become an aggregator of electric power on behalf of its residential users of electricity pursuant to the Government Energy Act of 2003, N.J.S.A. 48:3-91.3 to -98, and implementing regulations.
2. The Township will utilize approved vendors, Concord Engineering's d/b/a Concord Energy Services and Commercial Utility Consultants, Reverse Energy Auction Platform pursuant to the NJ E-PROCUREMENT Pilot program (P.L. 2001, c.30) under the NJ Department of Community Affairs. The Reverse Energy auction will seek bids from licensed and appropriate third-party suppliers. If such winning bid is selected and agreement executed, individual residential consumers would retain the option not to participate and to choose any alternatives they desire.
3. The Mayor and Township Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute any documents necessary to carry out the purpose of the Ordinance.
4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
5. If any portion of this ordinance shall be deemed invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder shall survive in full force and effect.

6. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption and publication in accordance with law.



WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Morris (the "Committee") desires to amend and readopt the language of the Code of the Township of Morris (the "Township"), Chapter 367 sections 4 and 5; and

WHEREAS, the Committee hereby finds and declares that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to replace and readopt the language of the Township Code, Chapter 367 and adopts the amendments to same; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Morris, County of Morris as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter 367 of the Code of the Township of Morris is hereby amended and replace as follows:

Chapter 367 Parks, Playgrounds and Public Places

...

§367-4 Adoption or amendment of rules and regulations.

The Township Committee of the Township of Morris may, from time to time, make, adopt, amend and repeal, by resolution, rules and regulations for the operation and use of the tennis courts, ball fields, picnic areas, parks and playgrounds, pickleball courts and other public places of the Township of Morris. Such resolution adopting said rules and regulations shall be on file in the office of the Clerk of the Township of Morris and in the office of the Parks and Recreation Department of the Township of Morris.

§367-5 Fees.

- A. All industrial, commercial and retail establishments or groups desiring to use a public park or playground of the Township of Morris shall pay the following fees:
 - 1. Morris Township industrial, commercial, retail and not-for-profit establishments or groups located in Morris Township using a facility or sponsoring a team shall pay a use fee of \$60 per three-hour event and a use fee of \$300 for up to 17 three-hour events during a continuous one-hundred-twenty-day period.
 - 2. Non-Morris-Township industrial, commercial, retail and not-for-profit establishments or groups using a facility or sponsoring a team shall pay a use fee of \$100 per three-hour

event and a use fee of \$500 for up to 17 three-hour events during a continuous one-hundred-twenty-day period.

3. Individual Morris Township residents may reserve a facility at a Township park for a single-day family event up to 50 people for a fee of \$25 for a five-hour permit period.
4. Use fees may be waived for not-for-profit groups and associations serving Morris Township area residents and providing recreation, educational and cultural programming.
5. Security fees.
 - a. Industrial, commercial, retail and not-for-profit applicants may be required to post a security fee with the Department of Parks and Recreation in the following amounts:

Participants	Fee
1 to 100	\$100.00
101 to 250	\$200.00
251 to 500	\$300.00
501 to 1,000	\$500.00
1,001 plus	\$1,000.00

- b. Security fees shall be returned only after inspection of the facilities for damages by representatives for the Parks and Recreation Department. Security fees may be retained in whole or in part to offset the costs of labor and materials to make repair of damages.
- B. Any person wishing to use any Township Pickleball Court shall be required to first register and obtain an annual Pickleball pass or be playing as a guest of a registered player with a valid guest pass. The fees for an annual Pickleball pass are as follows:
 1. Resident fee for a Pickleball annual pass shall be \$25.00 per person per year (includes an annual guest pass).
 2. Non-Resident fee for a Pickleball annual pass shall be \$175.00 per person per year.
 3. All Pickleball fees shall be for the Calendar Year and shall not be pro-rated.
 4. Resident Fees required under this subsection shall be waived for any Township Resident receiving public assistance. For the purposes of this section, public assistance shall include participation in the following: welfare assistance, subsidized housing, federal school lunch program, food stamps, or other forms of public assistance.

Section 2. Severability.

If any portion of this ordinance shall be deemed invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder shall survive in full force and effect.


Section 3. Repealer.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances or resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.


Section 4. When Effective.
